REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW – Upon a motion made by Deputy Mayor Christiansen and seconded by Trustee Parisi, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (#2015-170), to acknowledge the return of the 2014/2015 tax roll and warrant and report of unpaid taxes pursuant to § 1436 of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York.

- Fire Department Issues:
 - Fire House bay doors the rail and wheels are not large enough to carry the weight of the doors

 - Ambulance re-bid new specs will be re-sent and the fire department is requesting that it be re-bid.
 - Ambulance repairs emergency repairs done at Hassett Ford for approximately \$5,000
 - Fly Car repairs emergency repairs done at Security Dodge for approximately \$3,500

GENERATOR GRANT LEAD AGENCY & SEQRA - Upon a motion made by Trustee Parisi and seconded by Deputy Mayor Christiansen, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (#2015-171), That the Village Board declares itself, pursuant to SEQRA, as Lead Agency in connections with the Nassau County Community Revitalization Program Project Application to provide funding for a new generator for the Water Department for \$148,000; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Board classifies this application as unlisted actions which will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Board issues a negative declaration and notice of determination of non-significance in connection with this application.

DISPATCH BOOTH GRANT LEAD AGENCY & SEQRA – Upon a motion made by Trustee Parisi and seconded by Deputy Mayor Christiansen, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (#2015-172), That the Village Board declares itself, pursuant to SEQRA, as Lead Agency in connections with the Nassau County Community Revitalization Program Project Application to provide funding for Fire Department Radio Dispatch System Improvements for \$190,000; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Board classifies this application as unlisted actions which will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Board issues a negative declaration and notice of determination of non-significance in connection with this application.

The Board of Trustees will authorize the Fire Department to develop specs to create a new sound proof dispatch office. Commissioner O'Brien will help with the specs.
