

WORK SESSION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
Monday, June 27, 2016
INC. VILLAGE OF FARMINGDALE

The Work Session of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale was held at Village Hall, 361 Main Street, Farmingdale, New York on Monday, June 27, 2016.

Mayor Ekstrand opened the meeting at 7:05 p.m.

Administrator Harty advised the Board of the status of the following matters:

- New Chief's car should be delivered within 10 days;
- Lighting fixture at the rear of the Fire House cannot be fixed. The Board requested that a new fixture, closely resembling existing fixtures, be purchased and installed.
- Exhaust for the air conditioning unit in the computer room in the Fire House will be reworked so it can be properly vented.
- Work on the pressure zone upgrade in the north quadrant of the Village is progressing on schedule. Will be completed by the beginning of September.
- Prices for the communications upgrades in the Water Department are being evaluated.
- Installation of the LED lights in the Village have been completed. LED lights will be installed in fixtures in Parking Lots 2, 4 and 1.
- Savik & Murray working on plan for renovation of Parking Lots 3 and 7 as well as proposed parking lot at Jackson Avenue.
- Meters are "live" at Jefferson Plaza.
- Parking Lot stripping in Lot 4 behind Village Hall has been completed.

Joe Fortuna, member of the Farmingdale Village Merchants Association addressed the Board. Events planned include four evenings of music and outdoor dining, July 14th, July 28th, August 11th and August 25th and will be called Farmingdale Live at Five on Main. Attorney DeBellis will trademark two names: Live at Five on Main and Farmingdale Live at Five on

Main. Main Street will be closed during these events from South Front Street to Conklin Street and Conklin Street to Prospect Street. The Fire Department must be notified in advance of these events enabling them to make plans to relocate the trucks for egress in case of need. Other events being discussed by the Association include a San Gennaro Feast in September (September 18th or 25th) and a Halloween Parade on October 30th.

The Board discussed an email received this date from the resident of 6 Sherman Road regarding lack of water pressure. The Board requested that Superintendents Fisch and Gerheart perform some additional tests on the piping and Attorney DeBellis review the code as to the Village's responsibilities and that of the resident. Deputy Mayor Christiansen will communicate this information to the resident.

Public Hearings: The Board discussed the upcoming Hearing on Food Trucks and requests from Nassau Planning Commission that locations of vehicles be communicated to the Commission. Consideration is being given by the Board to removing the language previously incorporated into the proposed Local Law, i.e., Food Trucks will never be permitted on Main Street and include language stating that Food Trucks will be permitted to operate on Main Street when the street is closed to vehicular traffic.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:25 PM upon motion made by Trustee Parisi, seconded by Deputy Mayor Christiansen. Motion carried, all voting aye.
