Mayor Ekstrand opened the meeting at 7:20 p.m. with the pledge of allegiance.

The following topics were discussed:

- National Grid/Main Street Gas Main Replacement rescheduled to August 26, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.
- Hal Fuchs 330 Conklin St:
 - Proposal to add interior space for entertainment/catering and fill in the alcove facing Conklin St. with additional space under the roof.
 - The proposal currently generates a 28 parking space deficit as retail. The actual deficit could be significantly higher, depending on final use of the proposed construction.
 - Applicant will need to purchase 3 parking spaces if the Board agrees to waive 90% under basic retail proposal.

USE OF FACILITIES - Upon a motion made by Trustee Priestley and seconded by Deputy Mayor Barrett, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (**#2020-08-18**), to approve a request by Comforted Companions Veterinary Care to use the Village Green for a Back-To-School Photo Shoot on Thursday, September 5, 2019 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

OUTDOOR DINING - Upon a motion made by Trustee Addeo and seconded by Trustee Priestley, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (#2020-08-19), to approve an Outdoor Dining Permit for 317 Main Street.

Barricades, code and light stands may be needed. No alcohol outside and zeppoles, gelato and cannolis will be offered.
- Deputy Mayor Barrett indicated that Margaret Barrett would like to establish "Winter Wonderland" in the Village to celebrate the holiday season. The Board suggested that the Farmingdale Chamber of Commerce move the Holiday Parade to the Saturday after the Thanksgiving Day weekend and couple it with interactive activities for children and

vendors on the Village Green. Activities may also include window painting with holiday scenes and judging for winners, carolers to roam between the Village Green and the LIRR and to engage the Farmingdale schools in both the window artwork and musical performances.
