Upon a motion made by Trustee Parisi and seconded by Trustee Ryan, the following was unanimously, **RESOLVED** (#2015-121),

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees ("BOARD") for the Inc. Village of Farmingdale ("VILLAGE") wishes to recodify the VILLAGE code ("ACTION"); and

WHEREAS, the ACTION is subject to review under 6 NYCRR Part 617, the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, ("SEQRA"); and

WHEREAS, the ACTION is subject to referral to the Nassau County Planning Commission ("NCPC") for its review pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 239-m; and

WHEREAS, the BOARD wishes to comply with SEQRA and the General Municipal Law; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

The BOARD declares itself Lead Agency pursuant to SEQRA, classifies the ACTION as an unlisted action with no significant, adverse environmental impacts, issues a negative declaration and notice of determination of nonsignificance and refers the matter to the NCPC.

BEAUTIFICATION – Deputy Mayor Christiansen reported that the Village received many compliments on the fall flower decorations throughout the Village including Main Street pots, Village Green, Main and Melville Road triangle and Gerngras Park. The fall display of flowers,

hay and pumpkins in Village Green and the mum display in the fountain at Village Green were very well received. She thanked the many volunteers who worked over several days on these projects and also our DPW staff who maintained the flowers.

The schedule for holiday decorating begins on November 20th with volunteers from the Women's Club checking the lights on the wreaths; hanging of wreaths and garland on Saturday, November 22nd and decorating the Main and Melville Road triangle on Monday, December 1st. Deputy Mayor Christiansen reminded everyone that many volunteers are needed as there are over 90 wreaths to be hung.

Superintendent Fisch has made arrangements with the Village of Amityville to borrow the bucket truck to put the lights on the tri-centennial tree and the Town of Oyster Bay to put up the lights on Main Street and the candy canes on Conklin Street and Route 109.

- Rich Gosline, 25 Linwood Avenue, requested that the 4 storm drains on Thomas Powell Blvd. be cleaned out by DPW.
- Frank LiCausi asked when the Village will clean up 137 Main Street property. Administrator Harty said he would look into it.
