**RESOLVED** (#2020-11-12), to hire Peter Mastrandrea as a Part-Time Dispatcher at a salary of \$15.00 per hour.

**RESOLVED** (#2020-11-14), to authorize Mayor Ekstrand to retain Tate Grossman Kelly & Iaccarino, LLP to prosecute any legal claim against manufacturers and distributors of opioids arising out of the manufacturers' and distributors' fraudulent, negligent and otherwise wrongful conduct.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees ("Village Board") of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale ("Village") upon due consideration have determined that the Village has suffered and will continue to suffer significant adverse effects as a consequence of the opioide crisis; and

WHEREAS, Village Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the Village to join the Multi-District Litigation brought by various municipalities and seek to recover for the damages caused by various opioid manufacturers and distributors litigation currently pending in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

The Mayor is hereby authorized to retain Tate Grossman Kelly & Iaccarino, LLP to prosecute any legal claim against manufactures and distributors of opioids arising out of the manufacturers' and distributors' fraudulent, negligent and otherwise wrongful conduct.

**RESOLVED** (#2020-11-15), to direct Village Attorney DeBellis to communicate with the various fiber optic providers and distributors, to advise said entities that they require a license and to negotiate a license permitting each entity to maintain their equipment and facilities in the Village rights of way for a reasonable fee and in accordance with a written agreement.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees ("Village Board") of the Incorporated Village of Farmingdale ("Village") upon due consideration have determined that various fiber optic providers and distributors have installed their equipment and facilities in the right of way within, and without the permission of, the Village without any remuneration to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board desires to communicate with that various fiber optic providers and distributors and grant each a license to maintain their equipment and facilities in the Village rights of way for a reasonable fee and in accordance with a written agreement;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

Counsel is directed to correspond and otherwise communicate with the various fiber optic providers and distributors, to advise said entities that they require a license and counsel is directed to negotiate a license permitting each such entity to maintain their equipment and facilities in the Village rights of way for a reasonable fee and in accordance with a written agreement.
