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2 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: I call the
3 meeting to order for June 13, 2024.

4 I need a motion to waive the
5 reading of the minutes from the last
6 meeting.

7 MS. TULLY: I make a motion to
8 waive the reading of the minutes from
9 the last meeting.

10 MS. CARPENTER: I'll second it.

11 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: All in
12 favor?

13 (WHEREUPON, there was a
14 unanimous, affirmative vote of the
15 Board members present. Motion passed
16 3-0.)

17 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Motion
18 carried.

19 Okay. The first case is
20 leftover from last month. It's Case
21 No. 4-1.

22 MS. TULLY: Two months.

23 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Two months,
24 excuse me.

25 141 Division Street about a

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2 fence.

3 We did some research, and
4 everything is in order. So we are going
5 to pass that motion to approve that
6 application at this meeting.

7 Do I have a motion?

8 MS. TULLY: I make a motion to
9 approve the application as submitted
10 for 141 Division Street, Case No. 4-1.

11 MS. CARPENTER: I'll second it.

12 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: All in
13 favor?

14 (WHEREUPON, there was a
15 unanimous, affirmative vote of the
16 Board members present. Motion passed
17 3-0.)

18 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Motion
19 carried. You're all set.

20 MS. SHIE: Thank you.

21 MR. HONG: Thank you so much.

22 * * * *

23 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Okay. Next,
24 Case No. 6-1, Cynthia Hare and
25 Christopher Hare, 9 Arthur Street.

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2 Permit to erect a four-foot fence.

3 They need a variance for, oh, front
4 yard because this is a corner yard
5 property.

6 You guys can come up if you want,
7 state your case, your names for the
8 record.

9 MS. HARE: Cynthia Hare and
10 Chris.

11 We had bushes on the side of our
12 yard. And over the course of many
13 years, this past winter, they died.
14 They were broken down in the middle, so
15 we tore it down. And we have two
16 little boys, so we're hoping to put the
17 fence in to, kind of, keep them inside
18 because we don't have a big backyard
19 with grass, we have a deck. So that
20 side part, technically, on Thomas
21 Powell is, like, our backyard.

22 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: We get this
23 all the time because you have two front
24 yards, and that throws the rule book in
25 a tizzy.

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2 MR. HARE: It's more security
3 for the boys.

4 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Yeah. Do
5 you know where the property line is
6 exactly?

7 MR. HARE: I think we --

8 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: In relation
9 to the sidewalk.

10 MR. HARE: I think it might be a
11 foot off. I think you guys have the
12 survey.

13 MS. TULLY: It doesn't really
14 mark the sidewalks.

15 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: It doesn't
16 really show.

17 MS. TULLY: Well, you know, it
18 does show the bushes.

19 MR. HARE: The hedges have been
20 there since the '50s. I think it's,
21 like, a foot in.

22 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: From the
23 sidewalk?

24 MR. HARE: I think.
25 Technically.

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2 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Okay.

3 MS. HARE: I can tell you.

4 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: She's got
5 good pictures there.

6 MS. HARE: 22 feet from the
7 house and 28 feet from the fence where
8 the bushes are now to the curb of
9 Thomas Powell Boulevard. I don't know
10 if this helps.

11 (WHEREUPON, a document was
12 handed from Ms. Hare to Chairman
13 Nostrand.)

14 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: What I'm
15 getting to is this, normally we ask --

16 MS. TULLY: It's saying it's 30
17 feet from the edge of the house.

18 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: (Continuing)
19 -- that you put the fence on the
20 property line, or two feet in. There's
21 enough space there (indicating).

22 MR. HARE: That's fine. We just
23 want something for the boys.

24 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: We don't
25 have a problem with the fence. These

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2 surveys you have are very vague.

3 MR. HARE: Well, we did it with
4 the Carmans.

5 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: That doesn't
6 mean anything.

7 THE COURT REPORTER: Excuse me.
8 You said the Carmans?

9 MS. HARE: Yeah. Up here
10 (indicating).

11 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: The law
12 firm. That's not important.

13 MS. HARE: I just took this
14 picture before we left.

15 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Right. No,
16 we have all that. We have shrubs.

17 MS. CARPENTER: So the sidewalk
18 -- this is Thomas Powell (indicating)?

19 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Let's go off
20 the record. A sidebar. She can't take
21 five people talking at the same time.

22 (WHEREUPON, a discussion was
23 held off the record beginning at
24 8:06 p.m. with the proceedings resuming
25 at 8:10 p.m. as follows:)

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2 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: So we are
3 back on the record.

4 MS. TULLY: Are there any
5 questions from the audience?

6 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: No audience
7 to ask questions, so we can't see if
8 there are any objections.

9 MS. TULLY: We do need to
10 collect the green cards.

11 MS. HARE: Oh, yes. I have all
12 that.

13 (WHEREUPON, documentation was
14 handed from Ms. Hare to Ms. Tully.)

15 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: We need a
16 motion to allow for the fence to be a
17 foot and-a-half back from the property
18 line, which would be 28 and-a-half feet
19 from the house and to stop at the front
20 line of the house.

21 MR. HARE: Is it -- I know we
22 highlighted. Is it okay that we put a
23 fence on that side (indicating)?

24 MS. CARPENTER: In the back?

25 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Is that on

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2 your line?

3 MS. CARPENTER: Back here

4 (indicating)?

5 MS. TULLY: Oh, right here

6 (indicating)?

7 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: That's the

8 property line; right?

9 In the back?

10 MS. CARPENTER: Is there a fence

11 there now?

12 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: There's no

13 fence there now?

14 MS. HARE: No.

15 MS. CARPENTER: Oh. We thought

16 there was.

17 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: What about

18 across the whole back, there's no fence

19 there?

20 MS. HARE: The whole back, but

21 then it stops.

22 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Oh. Here

23 somewhere (indicating)?

24 MS. HARE: Mm-hmm.

25 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Yeah. You

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2 can run it there.

3 MS. TULLY: You're allowed to do
4 that. It's just this piece that's
5 tricky (indicating).

6 MS. CARPENTER: The Thomas
7 Powell side. And you're going to do a
8 four-foot fence, or these will be six?

9 MR. HARE: Four.

10 MS. TULLY: They can do six in
11 the back.

12 MS. CARPENTER: Yeah, I just
13 wondered. That's why I'm saying.
14 Because the back one could be six.

15 MR. HARE: Well, the back is six
16 foot, but this is going to be four foot
17 just for the boys (indicating).

18 MS. CARPENTER: Okay.

19 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: So it will
20 drop down here (indicating) to four
21 feet because you're along the road.

22 MS. HARE: Yes.

23 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: And you'll
24 have another four feet there
25 (indicating).

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2 MR. HARE: Yes.

3 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Are you
4 going to run it to the back of the
5 house?

6 MS. HARE: Maybe in just a foot
7 or two.

8 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Well, that's
9 up to you.

10 MS. CARPENTER: Dave's going to
11 come by and check.

12 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: I'm
13 redesigning.

14 MS. TULLY: And you don't need a
15 variance for this either (indicating).

16 MS. HARE: Okay. Can I ask why
17 you can't go past in front of the
18 house?

19 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: That's
20 another Code forever. Like I was
21 saying with that picture you had, where
22 the side fence can't go past the front
23 line of the house, so that picture you
24 showed us before, that's --

25 MS. CARPENTER: They want to

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2 know the reasoning behind.

3 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Well, so
4 they don't have these big fences that
5 go right out to the street.

6 MS. CARPENTER: You can't see to
7 get out of your driveway.

8 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: This fence
9 line out (indicating), not this fence
10 (indicating), the one in the back. The
11 one that comes up to that (indicating)
12 is not allowed past the front line of
13 the house.

14 MS. CARPENTER: And then you
15 can't see anything.

16 MS. TULLY: Especially on the
17 corner.

18 (WHEREUPON, there was a sidebar
19 discussion held between Chairman
20 Nostrand, Ms. Tully, and Mr. Hare.)

21 CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: All right.
22 So we can make a motion.

23 MS. CARPENTER: I make a motion
24 to approve Case No. 6-1 -- Section
25 600-158; Fences Not Permitted in Front

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Yard -- we approve a four-foot high fence, 28 and-a-half feet from the house, not to go past your front house line.

MS. TULLY: I second.

CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: All in favor?

(WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous, affirmative vote of the Board members present. Motion passed 3-0.)

CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: Motion carried.

MR. HARE: Thank you.

MS. HARE: Thank you.

MS. TULLY: Second.

CHAIRMAN NOSTRAND: All in favor?

(WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous, affirmative vote of the Board members present. Motion passed

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3-0.)
