Isle of the salty shore and breeze and brine!

Paumanok was a name given to Long Island by Native Americans, and used by the poet Walt Whitman for the place of his birth 200 years ago, on May 31, 1819. The Cultural Arts Committee of the Village of Farmingdale is pleased to host a presentation and reading by Whitman scholar Karen Karbiener to celebrate the **200th Anniversary** of Whitman's birth.

Karen Karbiener is a Whitman scholar and teaches at NYU. Winner of the Kluge Fellowship at the Library of Congress and a Fulbright recipient, she has published widely on Whitman, including an edition of *Leaves of Grass*, two audiobooks on Whitman's life and influence, a book introducing Whitman's poetry to children, and a collaboration with illustrator Brian Selznick on *Live Oak*, *with Moss*.
