5. Water Department: Sampling and Testing of Well 1-3 of AOP/GAC installation by Philip Ross continues with well is now fully operational. New steel building to cover the GAC tanks at well 1/3 construction started, anticipated completion O/A 11/15/24. Additional Testing costs for newly monitored contaminants at approximately \$16,000/well. Plant 2 Construction to recommence O/A 11/6/24. Master Schedule is being worked on by PRI through completion for all wells (anticipated to be 5/1/25). PWGC following up on required testing to secure funding from legal settlements and potential federal and county funding, DR helped finalize all submissions. A grant of \$1 Million has been committed through County Legislator John Ferretti to offset costs of the new water treatment systems, \$500,000 has been received. Congressman Thomas Suozzi has informed the Village that a \$1.1 million dollar commitment has been secured in the 2025/2026 Federal Budget. Not a reimbursement grant. Evaluation of ground tank roof and structure for repairs and/or replacement is underway by D&B. D&B providing analysis for antennae replacement on elevated tank by AT&T.

- o Flowers are still getting watered every day, are slowly swapping flowers from the parking lot to the Main St. and downtown area.
- o Crews have been filling potholes.

- O Stapleton was notified to come in and remove and trim some trees on Conklin Street and the Prospect Street area.
- Meeting with Roberto Castro Landscaping along with Trustee Parisi and Superintendent Patanjo for the Yoakum Street Park plantings.

• Water Department:

 All communication going well with the new contract with the South Farmingdale Water District.

- Sampling and testing of Well 1-3 of AOP/GAC installation by Philip Ross continues. Trojan to calibrate the AOP to reflect contaminant level. SCADA system to be set to reflect the AOP contaminant level, all need to meet health department requirements.
- New steel building to cover the GAC tanks at Well 1-3 is on site, scheduled to start construction in two weeks. Pilings fort foundation complete. Additional testing costs for newly monitored contaminants at approximately \$16,000 per well.
- Plant 2 construction currently on hold. Pipe installation to connect into the system with cut ins to main trunk lines to be done as arranged by PRI when Well 1-3 is fully operational and will be done when peak pumping season is over (agreed to with PRI).
- PWGC following up on required testing to secure funding from legal settlements and potential federal and county funding. Deputy Clerk Ruckdeschel helped finalize all submissions.
- A grant of \$1 million has been committed through County Legislator John Ferretti to offset costs of the new water treatment systems. The contract was signed, Deputy Clerk Ruckdeschel is following up on grant requirements for reimbursement.
- Congressman Thomas Suozzi has informed the Village that a \$1.1 million commitment has been secured in the 2025/2026 Federal Budget. Not a reimbursement grant.
- o First WIIA grant monies of \$2.2 million has just been received for Well 1-3.
- o From John Falbo:
- Well 1-3 All AOP project testing is underway. At this point South Farmingdale and VOF are monitoring and changing all set points for both well and AOP for our system. This work is being done during working hours until we are comfortable with its production and efficiency.
- This has been a very heavy pumping season with just Well 2-3 and the boosters at Ridge Road. Our Water Department has been performing maintenance to the 2 wells at Ridge Road. Our proactive approach has kept chemical output consistent and in good standing.

- Yearly inspection of caustic chemical bulk storage tanks which is required by the DEC and was performed by H2M on Aug. 12. Waiting on their report which should take a couple of weeks.
- A broken water service at the corner of Cherry St. & Route 109 was repaired by the Village crew.

• Code Department:

- Weekly inspections of meters are done to check for any malfunctions (i.e. coins jammed in credit card slot).
- Deputy Clerk Ruckdeschel reported that electrification of all parking meters is underway.
- Sign posts and signage needs to be placed on Main Street. Sign posts received.
- Noise issues on Main Street will be addressed as noted by code officers. If complaints are received, please forward to appropriate code or building department.
- Make Uber parking/pickup on Main St. after 10:00 p.m. for implementation summer 2024. All signage (received) and brackets have been ordered for Main Street.

New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) professionals have completed an investigation regarding your concern for northbound NYS Route 109 motorists using West Street as a cut through, between the hours of 6:00 AM to 9:30 AM, to access westbound NYS Route 24 in Farmingdale. The investigation included a crash analysis, a traffic signal inspection, and field observations of the area.

Currently, there is a right pavement marking arrow, a "No Left Turn" sign, and a "Right Turn Only" sign on northbound West Street at NYS Route 24. NYSDOT does not have any documents on file authorizing this restriction nor is there an official Notice of Order on file for this restriction.

For the crash analysis, NYSDOT professionals reviewed the most current three years of crash data available from the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. The data did not reveal a pattern of crashes at the intersections of NYS Route 109 at West Street or NYS Route 24 at West Street.

Traffic volume counts showed a moderate number of vehicles traversing NYS Route 109 and NYS Route 24. Field observations did not show any issues with motorists exiting NYS Route 109 at West Street or entering NYS Route 24 at West Street.

An inspection of the NYS Route 109 traffic signal at NYS Route 24 revealed the timing was set on recall due to a broken loop detector. This loop detector has since been repaired and the traffic signal timing has been adjusted to allot additional green time for northbound NYS Route 109.

Based on the data collected and the engineering analysis, NYSDOT professionals will legalize the existing "All Traffic Right" restriction on northbound West Street at NYS Route 24 by filing the official Notice of Order. Once the Notice of Order has been properly filed, NYSDOT will upgrade the existing signs to meet the Federal Manual of Uniform Traffic Devices (FMUTCD) requirements. This restriction will make it illegal for northbound West Street motorists to turn left onto westbound NYS Route 24.

New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) professionals have completed an investigation regarding your request for median fencing along NYS Route 109, a "No Turn on Red" restriction on southbound Main Street at NYS Route 109, additional pedestrian crossing times at the intersections of NYS Route 109 and Staples Street and NYS Route 109 and Main Street, and an elevated walkway over NYS Route 109 at Main Street in the Village of Farmingdale. The investigation included a crash analysis, traffic vehicle counts, traffic signal inspection, and field observations of the area.

NYSDOT professionals recently repaved, narrowed the through lanes, lowered the speed limit, installed fully protected left turn arrows, and installed high visibility pavement markings on NYS Route 109. NYSDOT is also scheduled to lengthen various NYS Route 109 turn lanes. This lane work will be undertaken in an upcoming Safety Enhancement project which is currently scheduled for a bid opening in the Fall of 2025.

For the crash analysis, NYSDOT professionals reviewed the most current three years of data available from the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles including the December 29, 2024 and the January 2, 2024 pedestrian crashes. The data did not reveal a pattern of vehicle crashes. Traffic counts showed a moderate number of vehicles traversing this section of highway. Field observations did not show any issues with vehicles maintaining their lane of travel or entering/exiting NYS Route 109. Traffic signal inspection showed pedestrian signal heads with countdown timers working as designed.

Based on the data and analysis, the installation of a median fence or an elevated walkway is not deemed necessary. To enhance pedestrian safety, NYSDOT traffic signal mechanics adjusted the allotted pedestrian clearance time for crossing NYS Route 109 at Staples Street and Main Street. In addition, NYSDOT maintenance crews will replace missing "Pedestrian Warning" and "No Stopping Anytime" signs on

eastbound and westbound NYS Route 109. NYSDOT maintenance professionals will also install a "No Turn on Red" restriction on southbound Main Street at NYS Route 109. This sign work will be completed by the end of calendar year 2024.
